

#### **CHALLENGE BATHURST ends with international joy**

From CAMS Speed Read



Challenge Bathurst has enjoyed a successful 2019 edition with more than 100 drivers taking part in the four-day event at Australia's iconic Mount Panorama Circuit.

During the popular event, both regularity and supersprint competitors spent lots of track time vying for top spot in their respective categories and classes, including a number of big names contesting in the supersprint.

Taking place on Thursday and Friday, the supersprint had four classes



competing with both international and national stars all in the running for the main game, the Pirelli GT Supersprint.

Out of the 26 registered drivers, it was the three foreigners who made up the podium with British driver Ben Barnicoat steering his 59 Racing McLaren

720S to victory over Shane van Gisbergen.

The battle for top spot between the two drivers was split by just one second as Barnicoat was half a second short of breaking the impressive two minute barrier.

A further one and half seconds behind the 2019 Virgin Australia Supercars Championship runner-up was German Christopher Mies, who edged out Vincent Muriti and Luke Youlden in fourth and Garth Tander in fifth.



The other supersprint class victors saw Brett Hobson beat Harrison Jones and Tony Walls in the Group A class, while Matthew Cole took out Group B honours over Paul Plank and Jonathon Canavan.

The closest supersprint battle came in Group C as Damien Grima finished just half a second faster than David Withers to claim the class honours. South Australian Matthew Sims rounded out the class podium.

Once the supersprints were completed, all attention turned to the two-day modern regularity as five groups competed on the track across four 20-minute sessions.

In Group A, it was Gene Phillips who came away with the win as he ended the weekend with two session wins over Simon Tate who had piled all sorts of pressure over their four trials.

Like Phillips, Stewart Temesvary was the clear winner in Group B as he proved too strong for his group, coming away with three session wins overall.

Temesvary's class win put him in rare territory, with the New South Welshman the only driver to get a class podium in all four years of the Challenge Bathurst.

"I'm really proud to achieve that record and I was particularly pleased with my performance this year because I won the first, second and fourth trials," Temesvary said.

"After the third trial I knew I had a massive lead and about the only thing that would stop me winning the overall trophy would be a DNF in the fourth trial.

"I could have taken it easy and just circulated to stay out of trouble but decided to go for it and earn the title, which I did."

It was a much closer affair in the three remaining groups as consistency ended

up proving to be the difference.

At the end of the weekend, Anthony Colombrita came with Group honours without winning any sessions and it was story same Raymond Nonik's Group D Gordon win and Lovegrove's Group Ζ victory.



#### Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) in Speed Events

CAMS members are reminded that as of 1 January 2020, the mandatory use of Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) will come into effect for Speed events, whereby the vehicle entered is fitted with the necessary requirements to ensure the effective use of a FHR.

In implementing this for Speed events CAMS has applied the mandatory use of FHR to only certain vehicle classifications, those being aligned with the mandatory use across other disciplines of the sport. This will mean that:

- Each 1st Category (single seater) vehicle will require the use of FHR except if it is a Superkart or a 5th Category single seater which is exempt from the use of FHR; and
- Each vehicle which is the subject of a CAMS Log Book and classified as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle will require the use of FHR, the same as if that vehicle was entered into an event for one of those disciplines.
- A vehicle which is road registered will not be require the mandatory use of FHR, unless that vehicle is also classified and holds a Log Book as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle. This approach is to ensure that those vehicles which compete elsewhere that requires the mandatory use of FHR must now also use FHR in Speed Events.

CAMS wishes to encourage all competitors to consider the use of FHR whether it is applied as mandatory to them or not.

#### **Everingham gets first Super2 win in the rain**

Late mail from Speedcafe

Rookie and BLCC member Tyler Everingham took his first Dunlop Super2 Series race win as rain caused chaos in the Round 6 opener at Sandown.

The R&J Batteries-backed MW Motorsport driver was well-placed on wet tyres when the Safety Car came out but still had to fight Triple Eight Race



Engineering's Kurt Kostecki for victory.

Kostecki (#55 VF Commodore) officially was classified second after a 15-second penalty was added to Jack Smith's race while time, MWM another driver in Bryce

Fullwood is on the brink of wrapping up the title tomorrow having finished sixth despite being taken out by Thomas Randle (#5 Tickford FGX Falcon) on the Lap 8 restart.

The track was declared wet as rain fell with the cars on the starting grid, but all on the first three rows remained on slicks.

Fullwood led the field away from Armor All Pole Position, while Jordan Boys (#49 Image Racing VF Commodore) slid wide and dropped from second to fourth, behind Randle and Will Brown.

The #16 Altima led the race by almost a second after one lap, with Brown pressuring Randle until he ran off at Turn 11 on Lap 2 and half-spun on re-entry.

Everingham made a similar error and toured the infield as Brown forced Kostecki to jink onto the grass when he righted the #38 Eggleston Motorsport VF Commodore.

Kostecki had started on wets and on the next lap he passed Brown up the back straight, then Boys on the run to the final complex.

Brown had also picked off Boys again by the time the Safety Car was called on Lap 5 after Matt Chahda (#18 Matt Chahda Motorsport FGX Falcon) punted Brenton Grove (#10 Triple Eight VF Commodore) at Turn 2.

Fullwood not only lost a lead of around 1.5s over Randle and another four seconds over Kostecki, albeit rapidly closing, Kostecki had the wet tyre advantage with the rain still coming down.

Boys and all three Eggleston Motorsport drivers pitted straight away to get rid of their slicks, although Brown's service was particularly messy.

Fullwood, Randle, and Ash Walsh (#35 Matt Stone Racing VF



Commodore), waited another lap, and once everything had shaken out under Safety Car it was Kostecki leading Everingham, Dylan O'Keeffe (#44 Garry Rogers Motorsport VF Commodore), Smith (#21 Brad Jones Racing VF Commodore), and Zane Goddard (#28 MW Motorsport Altima), with Brown in 10th, Fullwood in 12th, and Randle in 13th.

The top six remained as you were for the restart but Randle aquaplaned into the first corner and just nicked Fullwood, causing the #16 Altima to spin as he sailed off in the #5 FGX Falcon.

Everingham got a run on Kostecki and passed him into Turn 1 on Lap 10, only for Kostecki to squeeze back ahead into the esses on Lap 12.

Kostecki then ran off at Turn 11 and dropped to third by the time he regrouped, leaving O'Keeffe in second until he sprayed it at the same corner on Lap 14 and ultimately fell to a nominal fourth.

Smith was second, a few tenths back from Everingham, but still with a penalty hanging over his head for spinning Chahda on Lap 1, and he did not get a chance to attack Everingham in any event.

The 2018 Super3 Series winner took the chequered flag half a second up on the 2017 Super3 Series winner after a time-certain 17 laps, five short of the scheduled distance, with Kostecki crossing the finish line in third.

The latter was therefore officially second in the race and takes over the same position in the series, with O'Keeffe getting a second podium of his Super2 career.

Eggleston team-mates Brown and Jack Perkins (#54 VF Commodore) rounded out the top five, while Fullwood got back to sixth and now leads the series by 356 points, one less than the advantage he enjoyed before the race had started. Rounding out the top 10 were Justin Ruggier (#88 Eggleston Motorsport VF Commodore), Goddard, Smith, and Walsh, while Randle was classified 11th after he too copped 15 seconds for the incident with Fullwood.

Chahda finished 14th but, having waited considerable time to service his drivethrough for the run-in with Grove, faces a post-race investigation.
