Round 5, 1<sup>st</sup> outright was Josh Redhead and Ray Winwood-Smith in the EVO 5, with some spirited sideways action from Josh, Tim Weston wrapped up the Championship in his TME Ford Fiesta ST followed by Josh Redhead not far behind.

This is a top result for both B.L.C.C members and the club congratulates them on their success.

For those wondering about this event it is held over summer at Sydney Motorsport Park under lights, the event is run by North Shore Sporting Car Club.

The tracks (usually around 4.5kms long) comprise of access roads, car parks and the drag strip at the southern end of the complex, It makes for some top spectating and driving.
