

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to our latest Blower for September 2023 – this may be the last one under the hand/keyboard of Bob. We are looking for a new Editor (please consider)

As the year rolls on it is a time to reflect on the fact that we cannot take all things for granted. This has been brought sadly to mind with our recent sad loss of Andrew Robinson, son of David and Mandy Robinson who are both Club life members. Andrew's passing was a very sad occasion and overwhelming respect for he and his family was exhibited at his funeral service by a massive gathering.

Moving forward it is regretted that for reasons unbeknown to us, entries for the Esses Hillclimb scheduled for 10<sup>th</sup> September failed to get anywhere near a breakeven level, to enable the event to run. Unfortunately, the Club has to set a calendar 12 months in advance with little knowledge of other events envisaged by other Clubs and organisations.

I must stress here that access to use of Mt Panorama for Club events is hindered by the "LOCK OUT" periods imposed by the major event organisers under contractual arrangements with Council. Accordingly, we are limited in prime-time access weather wise – further to this, running an event is a costly exercise with significant associated charges, perhaps not appreciated by those not involved in organising events. We don't get any discounts from Council and the charges are a gazetted rate which is set without exception - for example, a competitor vehicle usage charge, depending on the event status ie club, state or national.

It is anticipated that the annual Speed Weekend on 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> October will be more attractive – certainly the weather (fingers crossed) should be more friendly. For that event we will be entertaining approximately 60 vehicles from Variety Club of SA at the end of a charity run – they were here back in about 2015 for our May Super Sprint. Should be a big weekend.

I must advise, regrettably, that Bob Lundie-Jenkins has for personal reasons resigned from Committee and advised that he will not be around next year as he will be moving on to greener pastures. Accordingly, he will not be available to continue in his busy roles as Competition Secretary, (which is an integral part of Club operations), Blower Editor and also Clerk of Course at Quarry events. Bob's assistance will be greatly missed, as here again is a process taken somewhat for granted to those unaware of the effort needed to be put in so others can enjoy their passion for motorsport.

Finding a replacement for Bob, for both of those positions mentioned above, need desperate and serious consideration by younger members to carry the Club forward please – Bob (remotely) and others will assist and support new

persons and the tasks for a younger tech savvy individuals should be a "piece of cake" – PLEASE CONSIDER. Here is a great opportunity for those people who have put forward new ideas about how to run the Club's operations to have a chance to put them into action. Please don't let me hold you back as we need innovation (within the rules) and new blood.

I too would like to step down as President next AGM, to catch up on some retirement time, now that my wife Pam has fully retired – we want to do some overseas travel. As Bob has also suggested, I am happy to assist the incoming President if required, particularly with provision of outside of Club contact details. I am not interested in getting overly involved or interfering in the newly elected Committee as I encourage new blood into Club management positions.

Historic vehicle owners please keep on the ball with your vehicle compliance and log book entries- *please note that events listed in the Blower unless organised by BLCC are not covered as "Club activities"* as was assumed previously. Transport for NSW inspectors and Police are focusing on vehicle use with emphasis on vehicles that are obviously not very original. This comment is not a reflection on any of our cars I merely bring it to your attention should your vehicle be a little different to original if on "H" or "J" plates. There have been instances where whole Clubs have been audited and inspected after incidents and on a few extreme occasions number plates taken.

We still desperately need, resources permitting, to conduct a major Working B at the Quarry, in particular to clear some space to expand the available parking. Scott Sims was successful in securing some safety barriers from Coates Hire to erect in some areas around the courses for increased safety, particularly for junior competitors. When the time comes something will go out on Facebook and I hope all members who like to use and compete at the Quarry will be supportive of the cause - now is the time to get into action with your hands and fix those matters you may have liked to offer comment about at some stage. It is your Club and playground — look after it and don't leave the hard stuff to "somebody else" as they may not be available.

Please give your attention and consideration to future management needs of your club as we move forward. It is imperative that primary positions be taken up by members who have the Club's future in mind and ongoing activities foremost in mind and heart. Management should be for the benefit of all members across all activities.

Please note that in the event that nobody, for example, takes on the Competition Secretary's role, effectively this means Quarry activity won't happen as no permits will be acquired to facilitate the conduct of the event. Please note that events don't just happen - it takes preparation work in advance with coordination of officials and other resources including simple things like the BBQ.

It will further allow for the matter to be included on the agenda.

A resolution of the issue may not necessarily be forthcoming on the night. Once the matter has been raised and brief discussions held or matter dealt with, the member will be required to leave the meeting to allow for the Committee meeting to begin.

As many would be aware there is increasing pressure in our society to ensure that those most vulnerable are protected at all times and one way of doing that is to obtain a Working with Children registration.

MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA, the administrative controller of our sport, is moving to have all volunteers who are registered with them obtain WWC registration and your Club accepts and agrees with the value of this policy, not only to protect children but the volunteers working with children as well.

The process to obtain the registration is cost free and can be done online followed by a very short visit to RMS to finalise the process after initial registration on-line. All Members are encouraged to obtain the registration and Committee members are available to assist in the process if required. ### Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) in Speed Events

MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA members are reminded that as of 1 January 2020, the mandatory use of Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) will come into effect for Speed events, whereby the vehicle entered is fitted with the necessary requirements to ensure the effective use of a FHR.

In implementing this for Speed events MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA has applied the mandatory use of FHR to only certain vehicle classifications, those being aligned with the mandatory use across other disciplines of the sport. This will mean that:

- Each 1st Category (single seater) vehicle will require the use of FHR except if it is a Superkart or a 5th Category single seater which is exempt from the use of FHR; and
- Each vehicle which is the subject of a MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA Log Book and classified as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle will require the use of FHR, the same as if that vehicle was entered into an event for one of those disciplines.
- A vehicle which is road registered will not be require the mandatory use of FHR, unless that vehicle is also classified and holds a Log Book as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle. This approach is to ensure that those vehicles which compete elsewhere that require the mandatory use of FHR must now also use FHR in Speed Events.

Motorsport Australia wishes to encourage all competitors to consider the use of FHR whether it is applied as mandatory to them or not.

Competition was completed by 3pm and with the support of a number of competitors, all equipment was stored away and the final results and juniors presentation was completed by 3.40pm.

In the overall category, David Catt was first, Volkan Gunduz

was second and Mathew Paul was third. While in the juniors, Volkan Gunduz was first, Robert Neal Junior was second and Max Selmes was third.

A small trophy presentation was held for the junior placegetters as an encouragement for their efforts. The barbeque was very successfully conducted

by Neville Ling demonstrating his multiskilling abilities.

Deanne Hudson and Shannon Sims were our Timekeepers for the event and our Event Secretary Phil Burgett did his usual very competent and professional job.
