#### **NATIONAL CAPITAL RALLY**

The first round of the combined Australian Rally Championship and NSW Rally Championship had mixed results, four teams were entered two started but only one finished.

John Hills/Mick Tuckey (Escort BDA) and David Hills/Paul Bennett (Escort BDA) were entered in the ARC Classic class but did not start.

Leigh Gotch & John McCarthy (Subaru WRX STi) started in the FWD class and were second after SS1 only to crash out in the second stage and took no further part in the rally.

In the NSW Rally Steven Wells/Adam Geary (Escort) produced the best result finishing third in class to head the BLCC members' home.

#### PORCUPINE LOOKOUT HILLCLIMB - GUNNEDAH

Gwyn Mullholland (Mitsubishi FTO) travelled to Gunnedah for a Porcupine Lookout hillclimb. Gwyn managed a class win with a time of 41.37 seconds for the climb. The hillclimb attracted a field of thirty two drivers.

Two club members Aden Hadley/Kurt Woodward (Datsun 1000) contested the Wakefield 300 at Goulburn earlier this month with a pleasing result. After two practice sessions and qualifying the team had the Datsun in 25<sup>th</sup> spot on the grid in a field of forty seven.

The race did not start well when a BMW tried to exchange panels with the Datsun but Aden and Kurt were able to recover and finished the Wakefield 300 in 30<sup>th</sup> place completing 114 laps with a fastest lap of 1.10.34 only four seconds slower then the winner's fastest lap and less then half a second slower then their own qualifying time.

#### **Melbourne F1 Grand Prix**

Day 1 - Wow. What a ride. I put my name down after the Bathurst V8s to be a Fire/Rescue marshall for the Grand Prix in Melbourne, it seemed such a long way away, but here it was, we were on our way to Melbourne. Wayne and I were travelling down on Tuesday and Aden and Emily were meeting us there on Thursday. The trip itself was uneventful, I was a little apprehensive about what I was going to find when I arrived, but we forged on anyway. Accreditation was Wednesday and we negotiated trains and trams and finally arrived at Albert Park around 9.30 in the morning where I met Mike O'Conner (Chief Fire Marshall) who informed me that I was in 'Fire 2', a fire and rescue vehicle, and our job was fire and rescue (should Rescue be required). As we left Accreditation he dropped the next bombshell - oh, and by the way, you guys are the chase car. I nearly had a heart attack, the chase car! Well that is how the event started, and it didn't disappoint in any way. First thing on day 1 I had my first experience of the Albert Park Circuit where we proceeded to do a couple of laps (purely for reconnaissance purposes of course), what a track. We arrived at our position for the weekend, turn 4, and then we were scrambled (that's fire talk) to a fire between turn 9 and turn 10. A Valiant Charger had an engine fire and was in all sorts of trouble. We dealt with it in record time and then returned to our position, by this time full of adrenalin and raring to go.

Day 2 was even better. Our driver decided that I needed to pay a visit to Pit Lane so he drove through, stopping at each of the F1 teams garages on the way for me to take photos. This was the day when we did our first 'chase'. We lined up on the grid behind the V8s. Wow, do those things move when they get going, and so does our fire ute! I was holding on for dear life through the first couple of turns. What an exhilarating experience, heading for corner 1 wondering if all the cars were going to get safely through or whether we were going to encounter a major crash when we got to the corner behind them. We did a couple of other chases, we were on track behind the Carrera Cup, the Celebrity Race, and the Sports Cars, and then the 'big boys' took to the track. The F1 cars came out to play. Wow, totally amazing, especially to be so close to them and then the high point of the weekend, Sebastion Vettel broke down at our point and both he and his car came to visit. He was there for about 3 mins until his car was pushed behind the barriers and then he was collected by a 'boundary rider' (quys on trail bikes whose job it is to run messages from point to point), and he was gone but we had the car there for the rest of the practice session and got to have a really good look at it. What an amazing piece of machinery. The end of day 2 produced another 'scramble' to a fire in a WRX but it was a bit of a non-event.

Day 3 saw a couple of more chases and qualifying for the GP, when the rain started we were all starting to wonder what would eventuate, but it was smooth sailing all the way and qualifying was postponed until the following day.

Day 4, another couple of chases and the big race. All went smoothly and before I knew, it was all over. What a weekend. I owe a big thankyou to Chris, Mike, and Jamie, from the Melbourne Metropolitan Fire Brigade, who were my team mates for the weekend. What a great group of guys. I have been invited back to be the fourth member of their team again next year, and I think I might just take them up on it. Now I have just the memories and the photos, but I don't think I am going to

forget it any time soon. What a disappointment it was opening my office door and sitting down at my computer on my first day back at work. Bring on 2014.
