Presidents Report February March 2016

I would also like to thank all members of the Committee both old and new for taking up the challenge and welcome on board our two newest members to Committee, Toby Ivanovic and Tim Burt – the youth of these members will I hope, among other things, encourage others to follow and hopefully lead to greater things for the future to ensure the ongoing success of our Club. Thank you also to our new volunteers coming on board with the Website and Blower. The success of operations is a team effort.

Foremost in this report I would like to thank, on behalf of the Club, all officials for their contribution to the successful running of the first two rounds of the 2016 State Hillclimb Championships delivered by the BLCC. Special acknowledgement is to be extended to the Fire Rescue Team and others directly involved for the very professional manner in which the incident on the Saturday was dealt with and resolved – thank you. The exercise demonstrated a very high standard of professionalism to be admired by all. Our Club, thanks to the contribution of many members, is a very professional operation which is recognised by many outside officials, other clubs, and competitors alike and such is commented on regularly by many competitors and people that I speak to in my travels.

A review of the minutes and outcome of the AGM, highlights some gaps (vacancies) in the identified roles/jobs within the Club to which I would like to draw all member's attention in the hope and desire that some "new blood" might step up and volunteer to take on those vacant positions to enable our objectives to be achieved more readily - the roles are not difficult and a great deal of support and help will be provided to assist any new person. The required roles cover all aspects of our activities across both dirt and bitumen events without discrimination. Please feel free to speak to either myself or Scott at any time if interested and able to assist. If you feel more comfortable speaking to any other Committee Members to ascertain what work is required in those vacant situations, please do so and I will arrange to get information to you.

I would also like to encourage younger Club members (younger than myself @ 65 that is) to look at their skills and interests in terms of the Club's future, with a view to becoming accredited officials to facilitate their progression into roles such as Clerk of Course, Club Chief, Event Secretaries (paid position for large bitumen event after some training) etc. Don't be scared.

As the Club moves forward we should not lose sight of development of the new "Track at The Mount" and consider its potential for a variety of new opportunities for the Club in the delivery of events. Such a facility will also need some of the new officials we are hoping to attract and develop as mentioned

earlier. Information is sketchy at this point to say the least however, we have to remain aware. We need to be in a strong position with a good relationship with Council and able to strike early.

Further the Historic Vehicle Registrar (David Robinson) needs to be involved in and advised of renewal details(expiry dates etc). Vehicles disposed of or not registered are to have plates returned to RMS and Registrar informed as soon as possible with minimal delay


