Rally Team to clinch the 2016 Pipe King Southern Cross Open Rally Series title.

It wasn't a trouble-free run for the top three cars with Joe hitting a Roo prior to the start requiring a big effort from Chapman Motorsport and Reliance Rally Team service crews to get the car on the

John and Anne Fraser were fourth outright in their Lancer EVO IV which elevates John to 3rd Outright in the open series just behind Jon Flower from Sydney, who came home in 2nd outright for the year.



Steven and Amanda Wells came home 13th in a Datsun which was Amanda's first time navigating for Husband Steven. Hopefully Amanda will now want to do more events in the silly seat!

Mark and Harrison Hudson finished 17th in a Subaru GC8 with another consistent and

DOUG BARRY'S 2016

After traversing the length and breadth of the state since the opening round at Bathurst in March, the 2016 CAMS NSW Hillclimb Championship recently came to an end at the final round, the Huntley Hill in Dapto with the Bathurst Light Car Club's Doug Barry finishing second in both the round and the Championship.

After the 8 rounds driving his Lola T8750 Barry finished just 15 points behind Dean Tighe, who became the first Queenslander to take the title win since his famous and late father Ivan in '87 and '92.

The somewhat bumpy and rough Huntley climb is one of the most challenging on the calendar, and coming into the event Tighe with his Dallara Judd and Barry were the only drivers that could win the title.

On the day, it was ever so close as the pair continually exchanged the lead throughout, and after the prescribed four runs the Mudgee grazier Queensland led his opponent by just 2/100th of a second, but as the event was running ahead competitors of time received a fifth run, and Barry momentarily as bogged down at the start



Tighe leap-frogged him to take a deserving win by a mere 11/100ths of a second.

Following the event Barry complimented his rival on a fine performance.

"Dean really deserved the win, he had not competed on several of the climbs before, and he's had to do a lot of travelling all year to just take part. We really formed a great relationship throughout the year, and I really hope he returns next year," Barry said.



"Deans been sorting the Dallara for three years, and he's been competing in the odd event for testing, but he knew it was ready to win when he launched his full on assault this year."

"It's a top car, particularly with the electronic aids such

as traction control and launch control, but I'm not using that as an excuse; because if I could afford it I'd have it too," he said.

After the Kempsey round was called off during the day due to heavy rain and a serious accident from which the driver later died, there were still seven events commencing with the Bathurst double, the Esses climb on Saturday March 5th and the Mountain Straight the following day.

While many of the rounds were far from suitable to Barry's large and powerful Lola, which would have been more at home on the wide open race circuits of America where it came from, but it was certainly at home on Mount Panorama's Mountain Straight, coincidentally Barry's favourite climb.

However, it was this event that may have ultimately cost him the title, which he first won in 2012.

Following a third place finish in the previous day's Esses event, he came out on maximum attack the following day, however on his very first run of the day it all came unstuck when he had a huge accident after clipping the wall through the notorious Reid Park left hander at 235 kph.

After the initial touch the rear suspension and wheel were ripped off the car, and with the right rear dragging on the track, the front left wheel was lifted high off the ground, it careed out of control through McPhillamy park gravel trap and came to rest head on into the wall.

Despite all that, that single run still netted him third outright, but it also seriously damaged the car particularly in the suspension region, and that then put him

behind the 8 ball. He firstly had a major and expensive rebuild ahead of him, and then despite his relentless search for answers as to why, it never handled quite the same.



"Since the accident we'd been chasing a rear end breakaway, and it had a real flow on effect. particularly on bumpy surfaced tracks like Dapto, and it was just something we couldn't find.

However, on Sunday he worked tirelessly between runs, softening up the suspension to the

maximum, then taking it back to where he started, but along the way he now thinks he's found the problem, the right hand rear shock absorber.

Across the season Barry had three second place finishes and four third places, and he also won three non-championship events. They were a Hillclimb Descent at Bathurst, the first hillclimb at the revamped Gunnedah Hillclimb and a round of the Tri Series Hillclimb conducted on the Ringwood long track near Raymond Terrace.



2017 NSW Supersprint Championship Changes to Technical Regulations

A significant overhaul of the Types and Classes in this category of motorsport have been introduced for the 2017 season and competitors should note these changes before registering. This update has been necessary to reflect current trends in competitor mix and to bring the category classes closer to the National Championship classes. The following table indicates these Types.

The main changes are:

1. The introduction of CAMS Prodsports Groups 2B and 2F into our class structure and the movement of cars complying with those groups from existing classes into the new ones.

- 2. Type SV will be deleted as the other Types now cater for vehicles that were previously in this Type such as the new Type 4 or Type 6 dependent on the vehicle, with Type 5 also possibly being an option.
- 3. As the various Types have been formulated over the years, each Type has now been labelled in a more rational order from Type 1 to Type 7.

- Type 1 and Type 2 remain virtually unchanged.
- Type 3 is still based upon Group 3J Improved Production Cars. Group 2F (Prodsports) cars, which are currently permitted in this Type, are now not permitted. A new Type has been created based on Group 2F Prodsports vehicles based on 2F regulations as contained in the CAMS Manual. 2F Prodsports will become the new Type 4 in 2017 and this will be an additional Type.
- **Type 4** at present this Type is based on *Group 3D Sports Sedans* with four (4) classes that are determined by engine capacity. *Group 2B Prodsports* cars are currently permitted to compete in this Type but they are intermingled with the Group 3D cars in the various classes. Both Group 2B and Group 3D vehicles will still be permitted in this Type but that they will now be separated by having two classes for Group 2B cars

and 2 for Group 3D cars for 2017 based on over and under 4000cc engine capacity. This Type will become the **new Type 5** in 2017.

- Type 5 Unchanged with the exception that for 2017 ALL Clubmans, whether they run on slicks or road tyres and whether they are registered or not, will now run in this Type. However, road registered Clubmans on road tyres will be in a separate Class to unregistered Clubmans and Clubmans on slicks. This Type will also cater for 2A Sports Cars and Supersports (Radicals, Stohrs, etc.) as it does now and will become the new Type 7 in 2017.
- **Type 6** Unchanged except that the two road registered "Clubsprint" classes will now become "Naturally Aspirated" and "Forced Induction" instead of "2WD" and "4WD", and the "Pro" Class has been deleted.
- **Type SV** This Type will be deleted as the other Types now cater for vehicles that were previously in this Type.

The software for the 2017 Championship Registrations now needs to be changed to include these new classes and associated eligibility checks and as this isn't a simple task we expect Registrations to 2017 to open later in November. Bob Welsh will email all 2016 Championship registrants immediately 2017 Registrations are open.
