- Gnoo Blas display Mitchell Groves has volunteered to be the Coordinator for this event. Members who have indicated they would display cars include Mitchell Groves, Nigel Buttriss, Mick Williamson.
- Discussion took place re correcting work on the retaining wall on the side
 of the flat. Mick Williamson has approached a contractor re correcting the
 issue. It was felt that the Council had caused some of the issue by
 changing the drainage during construction of the internal access return
 road. Council is to be approached to assist with the remedial work.

RADICAL TIME ON THE MOUNTAIN

2019 Radical Australia Cup Races 1 and 2 were part of the support categories for this year's Bathurst 12 Hour and BLCC was well represented.

Two members and two former members teamed up in a pair of SR 3RS Radicals



and all had a ball. Shiels Brad and Grant Denyer drove No 216 with David Pennels and Matthew Windsor in the No 99 car. Grant was unavailable for the Friday race which required Brad to drive the full race distance, leading the race for several laps, but the car was excluded from the results after the

event for being underweight.

David and Matthew finished race one in 12th place from 15th on the grid but

weren't helped by the safety car which was deployed twice during the forty-five minute race, they also received a 60 second penalty for missing the pit window.



Saturday was

a better day for the PMF Motorsport Team of Grant Denyer and Brad Shiels car 216 with Matthew Windsor and David Pennels in car 99.

Grant and Brad finished 12th and on the way he smashed the Mount Panorama



Radical record four times from 2.12.2 down to 2.11.5252 before handing back to Grant who had started the race.

Matthew and David finished 14th with Matthew starting the race and David finishing, this time without penalty.

PORSCHE WINS THE 2019 12 HOUR

Porsche has won the Liqui-Moly Bathurst 12 Hour for the first time, after an

audacious move by Earl Bamber Motorsport's Matt Campbell at Forrest's Elbow.

The Australian youngster passed the Aston Martin of Jake Dennis with eight minutes remaining and crossed the line first in the Porsche GT3-R he shared with Dirk Werner and Dennis Olsen.



The result was subject to a

post-race investigation into a Campbell's pass on Chaz Mostert into The Chase in the final hour, when they were contesting third place.

Campbell concluded the 12 Hours with a winning margin of 3.4413 seconds over Dennis, while GruppeM's Mercedes won a fierce fight for the final podium place. In the closing laps, Raffaele Marciello kept Supercars stars Shane van Gisbergen and Mostert at bay, their Mercedes and BMWs taking fourth and fifth.



That top five was covered by just 8.9s and the rapid pace led to a new race record, the 312 completed laps surpassing the tally of 297 in 2016.

Mostert's BMW Team Schnitzer M6 led the way at the halfway mark, following a morning with

trouble for some high-profile entries.

Strategies played out through the afternoon, particularly after the #911 and #912 Porsches – Campbell's entry the latter – stayed out during a caution period in the eighth hour. That put them nearly half-a-stint out of sequence, and subsequent green flag running took that shuffling of the order into the final 75 minutes.

The top group gradually thinned out as entries including the #911 succumbed to

mechanical problems, leaving seven cars on the lead lap.

EBM with the #912 Porsche had to start the final round of stops, Campbell doing so from the lead.

It opted to fit four fresh tyres, unlike the other contenders, but that combined with the required fuel drops did not play in its favour initially.



Dennis' Aston Martin took the lead from second, after seven pitstops across 23 minutes and 12 laps either side of the 11-hour mark.



The last of those stops, by the #108 Bentley came with a major setback for Andy Soucek, who stopped at pit exit and could not get going – for the second time in the race. Having looked likely to emerge in third, Soucek fell to seventh and a minute from the lead by the time he was going again.

After that, Dennis led Marciello by 9s, with Mostert

and Campbell (19s adrift) and van Gisbergen (27s) the top five with 45 minutes to go.

Those margins had been trimmed slightly, and Campbell had forced his way past Mostert at The Chase, when the Safety Car was summoned for a stricken KTM 15 minutes later. That brought Soucek back into the equation and Triple Eight called van Gisbergen in for fresh tyres before the restart with 21 minutes remaining.

Dennis bolted at the green, while Campbell put his fresh tyres to good use to pass Marciello and give chase for the Aston. Campbell caught and passed Dennis, squeezing past at Forrest's Elbow and going on to win.

R-Motorsport's Aston of Dennis, Matthieu Vaxiviere and Marvin Kirchhoefer took second, well clear of the frenetic scrap for third.



Marciello struggled with tyre wear in the closing stages, while van Gisbergen put his fresh rubber to good use after the restart. It all came down to the line and Marciello – teamed with Maximilian Buhk and Maximilian Goetz - did just enough to deny van Gisbergen.

Seventh at the halfway mark

after a mixed morning, Triple Eight's Mercedes stayed in the top 10 and on the lead lap throughout the afternoon. Craig Lowndes and then Jamie Whincup completed their running, leaving van Gisbergen to jump in for the run home with just over two hours remaining.

Van Gisbergen chipped away at his deficit to the lead, 55s to the Campbell's Porsche and 40s to Dennis at the end of Hour 10. In the end, a podium was out of

reach by just 0.2042s, with Mostert's BMW – shared with Augusto Farfus and Martin Tomczuk – right behind.

Class B Porsche honours were claimed by Dunlop Super2 Series driver Brenton Grove, with his father Steven and Ben Barker in 16th.

Great to see Brad Schumacher back



behind the wheel after his crash in his Lotus at Challenge Bathurst, the team was lapping around the 2.20.1000

Brad had his share of problems during the 2019 Liqui-Moly Bathurst 12 Hour however, the final result would have been pleasing completing 266 laps and 3rd place in the GT4 class.
