#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT OCTOBER 2018**

The year is now drawing to a close - some might say thank you.

The past month has been reasonably quiet by comparison with a good attendance at both the October Khanacross and the most recent Motorkhana with a growing number of "come and try" starters. Thank you Cec and others for making it possible.

There are some important notices elsewhere in this Blower that I draw your attention to please - Historic Rego Holders, Working with Children and last but not least, the Presentation Night and Christmas Party Details. Please note the cut-off date for catering purposes - the chef needs to order goods. Thank you.

The recent AMSAG event at Oberon saw good representation from BLCC members, with Joe Chapman and Ron Moore leading the charge at the pointy end, followed by Toby Ivanovic and John Fraser for a while and Tony Jordan back a little way. The stars of the event however, have to be Harrison Hudson guided by David Catt, and Jack Mobbs guided by Lachlan Moore, who I understand finished 27<sup>th</sup> and 35<sup>th</sup> respectively. Harrison's first drive and Jack did most of the preparation of his own car by all accounts from Joe. Well done to all.

On a more serious note, John and Anne Fraser had a very lucky escape from a major incident during the event. It is hard to comprehend how lucky they were having regard to the distance they travelled and the damage to their vehicle. It goes to show how the safety equipment installed in vehicles these days along with other safety devices really do save bodies and lives. I organised the recovery vehicle for John and Anne and Brad's first comment when he arrived to John was "ah guess you won't be running tomorrow".

The question of the Australian Hillclimb Championships, which CAMS Hillclimb Panel are keen to see run by BLCC, is a concern to Committee, both present and into the future as the club requires some commitment from you to facilitate and deliver to the high standard normally attributed to BLCC as a result of a very dedicated crew (who are aging). A little bit of dedicated commitment across a few people will see it happen, however we must start now - NOT 2 months before – there is a lot more to be done as opposed to a normal Speed Weekend or the likes. There is a lot of support within the Club to assist you assist others. You will be helping all members, not just a handful. I look forward to having you contact Eric Thorpe or Ian Plenderleith please.

The BLCC Khanacross Rules for 2019 will be available very shortly and certainly out prior to the first event for next year. We are waiting for sign off by CAMS on National Rules to facilitate – a new 4K set of regs is also being formulated at the same time.

With regard to the matter of the Life Expulsion of a Member, things have moved forward after an approach by a fellow Member and friend of the affected person. As a result of the approach, I had a 2 hour meeting with that person followed by a 4 hour meeting with those 2 parties in the company of Vice President Ian Plenderleith, to discuss possible options and requirements to alleviate the situation.

The details of the various discussions and some possible options were put before the Committee for their consideration in relation to the severity of the penalty. After lengthy discussion, it was determined that the penalty be reduced subject to the agreement in writing of certain requirements and undertakings by the affected Member. Two further discussions, totalling about 4 hours in all, were undertaken and the matter looked to be heading toward a satisfactory resolution

The Committee's offer was however, rejected at the last minute by the affected Member for his own reasons.

This may or may not have been as result of a motion pending from Members at the September General Meeting. Legal advice was obtained in relation to this matter and that written advice was provided. It stated in summary - inter-alia that **"The constitution does not confer power on members at a general meeting to determine a method for dispute resolution between members and as a result, the resolution is not actionable".** 

Please be advised that the action taken by the Committee in this matter did not pertain to the one incident of 9<sup>th</sup> September that many may have incorrectly presumed, but rather many ongoing matters over a period of some years - neither did it relate to the content of an offending letter wherever displayed but rather the conduct and action of the Member.

As a result of the implications of the legal advice received and after further consideration, the Committee has agreed to allow the Member to reconsider his position until the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2018. All that having now been said, there will be no further comment or discussion on the matter entered into and I sincerely hope we can all now move forward to where we need to be.

Please remember and consider the need to assist with the Speed Weekend – I won't be here as we are competing in the Silverfern Rally in New Zealand so that should help. I won't be back in OZ till 4<sup>th</sup> December at which stage the Presentation Night should be finalised – thank you for your support and understanding over the past 12 months. it has been a challenge.

If anybody wished to speak to me at any time, please feel free and I will make myself available as I have offered previously – my phone is never far from me due to personal family requirements.

I look forward to the Xmas Party /Presentation night and hope to see many of you on the night.

For those competing and those traveling on our roads – stay safe.

Robert Dean stated that if the event went ahead then officials would need to commit to assist well before the event. It would be necessary to arrange approximately 90 officials to be available. Michael Tuckey agreed to take all comments to next Committee meeting for discussion

#### BLCC METAL CLUB BADGES

Michael Tuckey advised those in attendance that the BLCC Club badges would be available next week.

#### **CLUB DISMISSAL OF DAVID CATT**

Michael Tuckey advised those in attendance that Joseph Chapman had requested a meeting with David Catt, Ian Plenderleith and himself to discuss the Committee decision. After discussion, David Catt then rejected the 12-month penalty option. Robert Dean stated to those in attendance that members had different views on the imposed penalty and asked how Club could move forward from this issue.
