The Bathurst Light Car Club was formed in 1953 and according to the "50 Years of Motor Sport" book compiled by Geoff Benson, the first competitive event run by the club was a Reliability Trial. Car Trials and Rallies organised by BLCC

would continue to feature regularly each year until recent times with the Club organising road events from Club level up to National Championship events.

It was with this ongoing commitment by the Club to organising road events that the NSW Rally Panel presented the BLCC with the 2022 NSW Rally Legends

Award at a function held on the 15th November at Berowra. President Mick Tuckey accepted the award accompanied by Life Member John Paine.

In accepting this recognition, it was stated what a great honour it was for the Club and the many volunteer organisers and officials for their years of service to Rallying. The sport of Rallying has changed

enormously over the years as evidenced at the presentation, however the spirit generated via this form of motorsport continues today as strong as ever. Rallying

has had its "ups and downs" over the decades and road events were actually banned in NSW in 1969, so the Club organised Scavenger Hunts that year.

In 1970 restrictions on Rallying were eased and as Dave Johnson recalled at the Legends presentation, the BLCC organised the first Closed Forest Rally in NSW even before the famous Don Capasco Rally in Canberra.

Perhaps the highlight for the Club came in 1984 when the BLCC was rewarded with a round of Australian the Rally Championship. Known as the Mid-State TV Rally an enormous effort allocated by the Club with Director John Latham assisted by Rod Jones, Mark Blume (Secretary) road directors: and Robbie Porter, Doug Rowan, Margus Ratsep, Peter Keith and Ray Clark.

It was 1993 and 1994 before the BLCC again hosted rounds of the Australian Rally Championship conducted on a co-efficient scoring basis alongside NSW State Championship rounds with the 1994 event drawing what some claimed to be the biggest rally crowds seen in the Bathurst area. In 1987 club members Greg Brown (Deceased) and Arthur Davis successfully won a very close fought NSW Rally Championship with the final event conducted by the BLCC on October 17 that year. Colin Bond presenting a Legends Award to Miles Sandy (Winner of BLCC State Rallies, 1998, 2000 & 2003).

The Club has a reputation for producing many successful drivers and navigators who have represented the BLCC from Clubman level through State and National events up to International level and all have been known for their spirit of camaraderie and competition.

#### Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) in Speed Events

MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA members are reminded that as of 1 January 2020, the mandatory use of Frontal Head Restraints (FHR) will come into effect for Speed events, whereby the vehicle entered is fitted with the necessary requirements to ensure the effective use of a FHR.

In implementing this for Speed events MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA has applied the mandatory use of FHR to only certain vehicle classifications, those being aligned with the mandatory use across other disciplines of the sport. This will mean that:

- Each 1st Category (single seater) vehicle will require the use of FHR except if it is a Superkart or a 5th Category single seater which is exempt from the use of FHR; and
- Each vehicle which is the subject of a MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA Log Book and classified as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle will require the use of FHR, the same as if that vehicle was entered into an event for one of those disciplines.
- A vehicle which is road registered will not be require the mandatory use of FHR, unless that vehicle is also classified and holds a Log Book as a Race, Rally/Road or Off Road vehicle. This approach is to ensure that those vehicles which compete elsewhere that require the mandatory use of FHR must now also use FHR in Speed Events.

Motorsport Australia wishes to encourage all competitors to consider the use of FHR whether it is applied as mandatory to them or not.

#### **Super2 dark horse Everingham finishes Fourth**

Race wins remained Tyler Everingham's sole focus to the bitter end but Adelaide was not the best hunting ground and left the local in fourth place in the championship after Championship wins in the past two years.

Everingham was one of five drivers in mathematical contention for this year's Dunlop Super2 Series crown. Declan Fraser succeeded in taking the Championship after two frantic and incident plagued races to end the series on the streets of Adelaide.

Everingham couldn't overcome the determination of the cars in front and finished the two races well down. The 21-year-old has title-winning form, having won the 2018 V8 Touring Car Series.

Everingham has finished sixth in Super2 twice — in 2019 and 2021 — and has been a fixture of the front this year. However, a number of incidents have kept him from the top, notably crashing with Payne on the line in Townsville.

Everingham crossed the line in first at Sandown but was penalised over clashing with a backmarker. With the title in the offing, Everingham didn't go down wondering.

"I've had a bit of disappointment this year," Everingham said. "It's good to jump back up there [in Bathurst].

"Adelaide as usual delivered incredible competition and the walls, particularly at turn eight lived up to their reputations for causing upsets."

Everingham could have made even more ground, having claimed pole for the rained-out Bathurst finale. Payne, Best, Hill and Fraser filled positions two through five for that race.



Despite crucial points going begging, Everingham acknowledged that safety was the priority that day.

"Would have been good to try and get some more racing laps," he said. "Safety is the main concern; I can sit here all I want and say I would've liked to race, but long as everyone is safe at the end of the day."
