



Future Requirements for Members using Historic Type Registration Scheme

The subject of Members joining the Club simply/solely to utilise our access to the various Historic Type Registration Schemes without contributing to the Club, either as a competitor in some form or volunteering as an official to assist with the various events throughout the calendar year, was highlighted and spoken about at a recent General Meeting.

As a consequence, the Club Committee, at a meeting on 13th September, discussed the issue and took the decision to require those existing members and new members to take steps to meet those requirements to retain/obtain the privilege afforded through the scheme.

Accordingly, with effect from the date of this notice (23/9/2017), members using the scheme will now be required to volunteer (without being chased up) to assist at 1 Club event (Competition) as an official or as a competitor each year, to be eligible for continued access to privileges of the Scheme through BLCC. This will mean that by the end of 2018, the above requirements will need to be met for continued use of scheme beyond 31st December 2018. At this point (i.e. end of

2017) it might see some members who are not wishing to assist choose to move to another Club – that is regretted, however it must be a two way street.

It may be the case where the Club has a small number of members living outside/beyond a 100 klm radius who will find it difficult to comply – accordingly in those instances, and those only, will need to be assessed individually with discretion for approval not to comply with the Committee where fitting.

New membership applications/inquiries will be vetted to include acknowledgement of this requirement. It is not considered too much to ask members to contribute to the Club in return for benefits afforded to them.

SPEED WEEKEND WAS A BLAST

The 25th and 26th November rolled in with 84 entries in total for the Super Sprint and Mountain Straight Hillclimb events and the weather was perfect for both.

Saturday morning saw the area behind the main pit garages on Mount Panorama alive with drivers, officials and cars of all makes and models, lined up for final paperwork checks and scrutineering.



Distinctive amongst rumble v8 of Falcons and Torana's, was the subtle almost secret rumble coming from inside the deep carbon fibre curves of the 2017 Maclaren 720 S coupe of David Callaghan. This beast was to later demonstrate to everyone what can be achieved with a lot of money and a great

deal of engineering, but first thing in the morning, it just looked beautiful.

Competition got underway at 9.30am with competitors split into three run groups.

Taken to the top of Conrod Straight by Clerk of Course Dave Robinson and Assistant Clerk of Course Wayne Bowden, they turn around through the Car Club and line up two abreast at the start line. With the timing system all primed and ready, a green light sends them



charging down the fastest stretch of race track in Australia before swinging into the Chase and on to Murray's Corner and the finish line on Pit Straight. Competitors came from all over the central West, from Victoria, ACT, SA and from across NSW entered in 22 different categories defined by size of powerplant, modifications and drive system. While 74 entries were received for the Super

only made it to the start line and many of those experienced mechanical problems that would see them drop down the order and for some, put paid to their chances of backing up for the Hillclimb in the morning.



From the Officials point of view, a relatively incident free day was welcomed by all, despite some very impressive times being recorded by competitors.

The Maclaren of course shattered the timing sheets with a best time of 43.17 in the third run of the day, with second on the day going to the 1968 Ford Falcon GT of Steven Parashis with a best time of 46.78 on his fourth run after missing the second run for some mechanical adjustments. Steven went on to compete



the following day in the Mountain Straight Hillclimb and for his efforts took the Speed Weekend Overall Winner's Trophy.

Third overall was Tim Weston in his 2014 turbocharged AMG A45

Hatchback with a best time of 47.4 in his fifth run of the day.

A special mention should be made here of the efforts of Steven King, a long-time supporter of Bathurst Light Car Club events on Mount Panorama. Steven was able to complete just three runs down Conrod Straight before he unfortunately snapped an axle in his Uberkart Reaper putting paid to further participation, not only in the Super Sprint, but the Sunday Hillclimb which is his speciality in the ground hugging speed machine. Despite the untimely demise of the Reaper, Steven finished a very credible sixth overall with a best time



of 48.24 which is very fast when your backside is just millimetres from the race track.



In fourth place overall was the enigmatic Dave "Willy" Williams in his Holden SSV VE Redline Commodore Ute 666. Dave's best run was his second with a 47.94 but he completed all seven runs to win his Class by more than two seconds.

A couple of our junior

drivers were entered in this year's Super Sprint and they both handled themselves very well indeed. Harrison Field in his 1999 Suzuki GTI 64th finished in position with a best time of 60.33 and Izak Beresford



posted a time of 64.37 in his Mazda RX8 non turbo.

The morning of Sunday 26th November, Mount Panorama was a crowded place as the sounds of high powered machines echoed from the top joined with the sound of pounding feet and heavy breathing as more than 500 enthusiastic



competitors ran

Drivers, spectators and Officials stood and watch the

pain on the faces of many of the runners as they climbed the tortuous mountain. Once they had passed the McPhillamy Park Pits and the track was declared clear and ready for racing, the first group of the 58 competitors entered in the Hillclimb was led down the mountain to the start line above Mountain Straight Gate.

By the end of the day after four runs, Aden Hadley in his 180 Nissan SX emerged the fastest overall with a best of time 48.55 secured on his third and last run as his motor expired soon after the finish line. Second was again the big noise and performance big Ford GT of Steven Parashis with a best



time of 49.76, more than a second slower than Aden but good enough to give him the overall win for the weekend.

In third place overall was the AMG A45 of Tim Weston with a best time of 49.96



scored on his fourth run of the day for a very successful weekend of racing.

Once again the juniors did well with Harrison Field coming in at 49th with a best time of 62.82 and Izak Berrisford just one place behind in 50th with a time of 63.28.

At the conclusion of the two days it was generally agreed by all that the event was an outstanding success and capped off a great year of competition on track.

NEW SUP REGS FOR KHANACROSS 2018

The Club Committee has determined that the following will be the sup regs for all Khanacross events for the Bathurst Light Car Club in 2018 and they have been reproduced here for the attention of all members and particularly competitors:

21. SCRUTINY - SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS:

- Competitors must be a financial member of a CAMS affiliated Car Club and produce a current, valid Membership Card and current, valid CAMS 2s/j or greater Competition Licence at document check.
- Bathurst Light Car Club has elected to run their Khanacross events as per Group 4h Motorkhana code and schedule A of the current CAMS Manual. Unless specified in these regulations ALL VEHICLES must comply with Schedule A and Group 4H Motorkhana code of the current CAMS Manual.
- A fire extinguisher of at least 900g capacity, complying with Schedule H of the current CAMS Manual (refer "General Requirements for Cars and Drivers") must be fitted.
- Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.
- All vehicles, other than "Purpose Built Specials" as defined by Group 4H, must have front and rear bumper bars fitted as per the manufacturer
- 2wd Standard will be defined as a vehicle presented as manufactured with no modifications and may not use any Rally tyre or tyres marked "not for highway use" or "for competition use only" or use any other tyre not permitted under these regulations.
- 2wd Modified will be vehicles that comply with "Production Cars" under the Group 4H regulations in the Auto Test section of the current CAMS manual.
- 2wd Specials will include "Purpose Built Specials" and "Production Based Specials" as defined under group 4 H regulations in the Auto Test section of the current CAMS Manual
- 4wd vehicles must comply with "Production Cars" as specified in Group 4H Auto Test section of the current CAMS Manual and may not use any Rally tyre or tyres marked "not for highway use" or "for competition use only".
- Unless permitted in these supplementary regulations, tyres listed under article 1.5 in group 4H motorkhana code are not allowed. Commercially available light vehicle tyres, including those marked *LT* or *C* will be allowed provided these tyres are appropriately speed rated and the tread pattern is of a road pattern, not a winter tread or mud and snow pattern or of any other aggressive nature. Tyres listed under the CAMS production tyre list are eligible to be used regardless of tyre side wall markings."

- Vehicles competing in the 4wd class may use rally tyres or tyres marked "not for highway use", However if the entrant chooses to use these tyres they will not be eligible to gain points towards the club championship and will not be listed in the results of the event. Vehicles using these tyres must pay the appropriate entry fee and still comply with all other relevant sections of these supplementary regulations.
- Log Books as issued by CAMS or BLCC <u>must</u> be presented at scrutineering for each event. Club members can obtain a club log book from the Event Secretary.
- The Scrutineer will be the judge of fact in all matters relevant to vehicle eligibility.
